The Board of County Commissioners (BOCC) of Kay County, Oklahoma, met in regular session at 9:00 o'clock a.m. on Monday, July 15, 2019, the meeting was posted for public information on July 12, 2019, at 8:50 a.m. at the Courthouse front door, Commissioners Court, and basement handicapped entrance of the Kay County Courthouse in Newkirk, Oklahoma.

Chairman Jack Godberson called the meeting to order. Those present were as follows: Jason Shanks, Member; John Wilson, Member; Brian Hermanson, District Attorney (DA); Steve Kelley, Kay County Sheriff; Christy Kennedy, Kay County Treasurer; Susan Keen, Kay County Treasurer; Cheryl Howard, Kay County Election Board; Dennis Bonewell, Emergency Management Director; Jessica Windom, Ponca City News; Claude Williams, Taxpayers for Transparency; Sharon Rowen, kaynewscow.com; Tammy Reese, Secretary/Kay County Clerk. (See sign in sheet).

Chairman Godberson led the Flag Salute.

Motion was made by Wilson and seconded by Godberson approving regular meeting minutes of July 1 and July 8, 2019. Motion carried: Godberson, aye; Wilson, aye; Shanks, aye.

Motion was made by Godberson and seconded by Shanks approving reaffirming First Deputy District No. 1 decisions made in BOCC meeting of July 8, 2019. DA Hermanson felt reaffirming decisions was necessary in case someone wanted to raise a problem or question regarding actions taken. Motion carried: Godberson, aye; Wilson, aye; Shanks, aye.

Donna Parker, Oklahoma Court Services gave report presenting the number of community service hour's defendants are working and the projects they are involved in as follows: New community service clients-8; regular community service clients turned in for the month-63; sanction community service hours completed-200; total hour completed-627.33; community service offender completions-13. Completed Events: Santa's Helper Flea Market, Friendship Feast, Blackwell Museum, Hartford Avenue Church, Tonkawa Fire Department, Wheatheart Nutrition, Ponca City Lake, Newkirk Main Street, Ponca City Senior Center places clients assisted with cleaning and serving food. Up-Coming Events: Habitat Restore, Santa's Helper & Flea Market, Ponca City Disc Golf, City of Braman, My Favorite Things, Ponca City Lake, Wheatheart Nutrition, Friendship Feast where clients will assist with a variety of different tasks.

Motion was made by Shanks and seconded by Wilson tabling employee payroll deduction with RecPlex Corporate Wellness Program to see if there is enough interest. Motion carried: Godberson, aye; Wilson, aye; Shanks, aye.

Motion was made by Wilson and seconded by Godberson tabling approval of Resolution #19,20-25 letter of support of the Oklahoma Emergency Response System Stabilization and Improvement Revolving Fund (OERSSIRF) from Tonkawa Fire Department Ambulance. Commissioner Wilson said he would contact the department for clarification. Motion carried: Godberson, aye; Wilson, aye; Shanks, aye.

Motion was made by Shanks and seconded by Wilson approving Supplemental & Modification Agreement#1 County Improvements for Roads & Bridges Project Agreement between BOCC and State of Oklahoma Department of Transportation. Motion carried: Godberson, aye; Wilson, aye; Shanks, aye.

Motion was made by Shanks and seconded by Wilson tabling Agreement between Kay County and Architect In Partnership (AIP) to design an Annex to the Kay County Courthouse. DA Hermanson stated he had concerns about the contract regarding the 6% & 8% interest difference; he told in the first plans on new construction of an annex the interest was 6% and then the second set of plans the interest was 8%. DA Hermanson said after speaking with Matt Graves, AIP, Matt explained for the new construction of a stand alone annex the interest is 6% and on the remodel of current courthouse the interest would be 8%. Motion carried: Godberson, aye; Wilson, aye; Shanks, aye.

Updates of Annex to the Kay County Courthouse: Godberson said there are three different options and he was wanting to know which set of plans the committee was considering. Treasurer Kennedy said the

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stand-alone annex for the administrative offices (first set of plans) and remodeling the courthouse. DA Hermanson said all four Judges, himself, his Assistant and Sheriff Kelley met with Matt Graves, AIP, last week. DA Hermanson discussed the remodel plans, ADA compliance and security issues to be made to the courthouse. The annex committee has not brought a recommendation to the BOCC.

Expanding internet service in Kay County Courthouse: Treasurer Kennedy discussed her concerns regarding the internet service in her office. At this time there's more than one internet service being used throughout the courthouse; Kennedy is requesting all offices use the same service and asked the BOCC to consider expanding the One Net internet service (currently used by some offices) to better serve all the offices. BOCC asked her to get a contract to be reviewed and considered. No action was taken.

Motion was made by Shanks and seconded by Godberson approving changes on Road Use Agreement by and between BOCC and Duke Energy Renewables Wind, LLC regarding clarification of three (3) items on the Frontier Wind Power II Road Use Agreement with Duke Energy. 1) Article I, 1.1.b County Responsibilities; 2) 1.2.c Developer's Responsibilities; 3) 1.5.b Compensation Payments. Motion carried: Godberson, aye; Wilson, abstained; Shanks, aye.

Motion was made by Shanks and seconded by Wilson approving Business Associate Agreement by and between the Kay County Health Department (KCHD) and R.K. Black, Inc for Service Agreement on Printers. DA Hermanson stated the contract was confusing and noted it was for maintenance on the machines. Motion carried: Godberson, aye; Wilson, aye; Shanks, aye.

DA Hermanson referred to Health Department contracts already approved with contingency of having quotes; Clerk Reese stated quotes have now been received on the mowing contract, etc.

Road and Bridge Projects/Circuit Engineering District (CED) No. 8 Road and Bridge Projects: Commissioner Godberson said crews are blading and hauling material to flood damaged roads, mowing ditches, put in a culvert extension on Ranch Drive and South Avenue, put rip rap in ditch on east Ferguson and fixed buckle in concrete on "S" Street.

Commissioner Wilson said crews are still taking pictures of FEMA damages and went around site with ODOT for the major collector roads. He said crews have been knocking down the ruts on the roads, doing repair work on a bridge south of Hubbard on 124th, building up the road on "P" north of Hubbard, draining roads that are holding water, digging shale at the pit, hauling shale, grading roads, fixing washouts and working to get roads usable again. Wilson said there are still many roads with deep ruts and crews continue to work to get them smooth. He told he is waiting for a disaster declaration so the county can receive funding to purchase road material to fix the roads.

Commissioner Shanks said crews are having difficulty staying caught up. He said crews are blading, working on State Line, hauling 6" surge rock, getting silt off at Silverdale Lane. Shanks said north of Newkirk received more rain and crews are trying to get roads built back up.

Motion was made by Shanks and seconded by Wilson approving 2019/2020 ACCO-SIF Workman's Compensation Insurance Revised Renewal Quote originally referenced on Resolution No. 18, 19-147 to Execute the Agreement Establishing the Association County Commissioner of Oklahoma and Payment Option on Intent to Participate in ACCO-SIG. Clerk Reese said there was a calculation error on the first quote ACCO sent; she said ACCO's corrected amount is \$200,010. Motion carried: Godberson, aye; Wilson, aye; Shanks, aye.
